⁴To conduct this analysis, we downloaded and compiled two .csv files publicly available at OCA-STAT Act Report. Data spanned from November of 2020 to May 2024. We refined the data to include only disposed cases in which the top charge was a Class E felony and further refined that data to remove cases that were likely duplicates (e.g., where the case was consolidated into another docket) or cases marked "other," which were irrelevant (e.g., due to being abated by death). This analysis yielded 71,113 cases, of which approximately 33% were dismissed or acquitted. Of the remaining approximately 67% of cases in which defendants were convicted either through a plea deal or a guilty verdict at trial, 15,703 were sentenced to incarceration (approximately 33%), or 22% of total cases charged for Class E felonies.
